How Old is My Pet?

Correctly Calculate Your Cat or Dog's Age! - By Gayle Hickman

Most people think that calculating the age of cats and dogs in "human years" is quite simple: multiply their age by seven. For example, a 4-year-old cat or dog would actually be 28 years old in human years.

But when you really begin weighing out the arithmetic, this method doesn't add up. Say a 1-year-old dog is the equivalent of a 7-year-old human -- get out of here! How many 7-year-old humans are sexually active and capable of reproducing? Dogs and cats are much more likely to have babies at 1 year old or even at 10 years old, than any person who is 7 or 70.

CATS

Now let's take a glimpse at a simple formula for calculating feline age in human years.

Assume that a 1-year-old cat is equal to a 15-year-old human and a 2-year-old cat is equal to a 24-year-old human. Then add four years for every year after that. (Example: A 4-year-old cat would be 32 in human years.) The following chart shows this formula of calculation:

DOGS



Aging is much faster during a dog's first two years but varies among breeds. Large breeds, while they mature quicker, tend to live shorter lives. By the time they reach 5 they are considered "senior" dogs. Medium-sized breeds take around seven years to reach the senior stage, while small and toy breeds do not become seniors until around 10.

Many veterinarians agree that a pretty good guess on the age of pets can be made using the following formula. Although still simple, it is much more accurate than the seven-year method.

Assume that a 1-year-old dog is equal to a 12-year-old human and a 2-year-old dog is equal to a 24-year old human. Then add four years for every year after that. (Example: A 4-year-old dog would be 32 in human years.)

Since this method takes into consideration the maturity rate at the beginning of a dog's life and also the slowing of the aging process in his later years, Martha Smith, director of veterinary services at Boston's Animal Rescue League, feels that this is the more accurate calculation formula. Here is a chart, for easy reference:

Your Dog's Age 0 1 2 3 4 5 6 7 8 9 10 11 12 13 14 15 16 17 18

A dog's average lifespan is around 12 or 13 years, but again, this varies widely by breed. The larger your dog is, the less time it will live. Female dogs tend to live a little longer.






10 Amazing Facts About Cats!* - By Nicole Abrego

Cats have been entrancing humans for thousands of years. From the tufts of their ears to the swish of their tails, it's hard for us humans to ignore the mystery and beauty of cats. And if you're looking for some amazing cat facts to share with your fellow cat-loving friends, we have you covered. Here are 20 Facts About Cats that you might not have known.

- 1. House cats share 95.6% of their genetic makeup with tigers. You read that right, TIGERS. They also share some of the same behavior habits such as scent and urine marking, prey stalking and pouncing.
- 2. Cats can jump 5 times their own height. Now that's impressive!
- 3. A housecat can run to the speed of about 30 mph over short distances. This means that a cat can outrun superstar runner Usain Bolt in a 200 meter dash!
- 4. Cats can have a dominant front paw. Studies have shown that male cats tend to favor their left paw while female cats may have a dominant right paw.
- 5. Cats have a whopping 32 muscles in each of their ears, allowing them to swivel their ears to hone in on the exact source of a noise. Additionally, cats can rotate their ears to 180 degrees
- 6. Cats are nearsighted, but their peripheral vision and night vision are far superior compared to humans.
- 7. The whiskers on a cat aren't just cute, they serve a very important function in assisting cats with getting around, especially at night. Whiskers are embedded deep in the cat's body and are connected to the cat's sensitive muscular and nervous systems, acting as touch receptors (or a "kitty radar"). Whiskers allow a cat to detect and respond to changes in their surroundings.
- 8. Additionally, not only do cats have whiskers on their face, they also have a set of whiskers on the back of their front legs.
- 9. The oldest known pet cat existed around 9,500 years ago. In 2004, a French archeologist found a grave of a cat in Cyprus dating back to 9,500 years ago, meaning that humans have owned cats as pets since then!
- 10. In Ancient Egypt, members of a family would shave their eyebrows in mourning if their cat died. Cats were also sometimes mummified and placed in tombs with their owners.
